Final nominations must be received no later than midnight PST April 15th, 2013

TWO SIMPLE STEPS TO NOMINATE!

STEP ONE: ELIGIBILITY

Consider the category requirements:

BEST NOVEL - ENGLISH

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy novel in English, over 40,000 words by a Canadian, published in 2012. A work that is greater than 40,000 words and is published as a stand-alone book can be allowed in this category if the author wishes it.

BEST YOUNG ADULT NOVEL – ENGLISH

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy novel in English, over 30,000 words written for Young Adults by a Canadian, published in 2012. A work that is greater than 30,000 words and is published as a stand-alone book can be allowed in this category if the author wishes it. An author may request that their novel be judged in the adult category by contacting the awards administrator.

BEST SHORT FICTION - ENGLISH

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy short fiction in

English with fewer than 40,000 words, by a Canadian published in 2012. This category covers short form fiction in English such as novelettes, novellas, short stories and flash fiction

BEST GRAPHIC NOVEL - ENGLISH

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy graphic novel, single issue of a serial or an on-line comic in English, by a Canadian published in 2012. This category is for published works that are mainly graphical. The nominees can be based on the written word, illustration or colour work.

BEST POETRY/SONG - ENGLISH

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy poem or song in English, by a Canadian published or performed in 2012. This category covers Poems and Song performances in English. A song includes lyrics and music. A song may be available as a document that includes lyrics musical notation, as a recording, as a performance at a fan event or any combination of these ways.

BEST RELATED WORK - ENGLISH

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy literary criticism, book review, CD, critical editions, screen play, anthology, or a single-author collection released as a book in English, by a Canadian published in 2012. This category covers all professionally written works that are not covered in the previous professional categories.

BEST ARTIST

Best Science Fiction or Fantasy artwork or body of artwork, by a Canadian displayed or published in 2012. This category can be for a specific piece of art like a book cover or it can be defined for a body of work done during that year. Unlike the previous categories, this category is for both English and French artists.

(**Note:** This category is now only for professional artists who are paid for their work. Fan artist unpaid work is now covered under the Best Fan Work Related category.)

The following categories are for nonprofessional or fan work. Nominees are eligible for unpaid works. Both French and English fans may be nominated.

BEST FAN PUBLICATION

Best fanzine or fan newsletter or publication either in print or by electronic means, whose content significantly relates to Science Fiction or Fantasy, published by a Canadian at least once in 2012. This category covers both paper and web fanzines. It can also include on-line fan-run blogs or review sites. We require that a significant amount of their content to be dedicated to Science Fiction and Fantasy genrerelated topics such as books, movies, comics, gaming, filk or conventions. They cannot be ones that have commercial products for sale or be dedicated to a professional group or person. It must be fannish in nature.

BEST FAN ORGANIZATIONAL

Best organizational contributions to Canadian Science Fiction or Fantasy conventions, club activities or other organized activities by a Canadian in 2012. This category is for fans that run or organize non-profit/non-professional Science Fiction and Fantasy related conventions, clubs or organizations. This includes literary, gaming, comic and media events.

BEST FAN FILK

Best musical activities by a Canadian fan based on science fiction or fantasy in areas such as album, song-writing, video, performance or sound engineering in 2012. The traditional term for fan music is filk. We view filk as including Wizard, Timelord and Goblin Rock; music of the SCA; Tolkien music and other specialty types as they emerge.

BEST FAN RELATED WORK

Best fan activity in the area of Science Fiction or Fantasy not encompassed by the previous three subsections in areas such as art, presentations, performances, APAS, or fanwriting by a Canadian in 2012. It must be done for a related event or publication associated to the Science Fiction and Fantasy genre.

(**Note**: This category used to be called Best Fan Other but was renamed at the 2012 AGM.)

... and then wrack your memory to figure out if you know of anyone who is deserving of an award. Ask around what others think to jog your memory.

where eligibility lists covering all categories of the awards are maintained.

Note: being displayed on the above lists does NOT constitute being nominated for an award. The lists are merely incomplete databases providing some examples of individuals (and their works) who may be eligible to be nominated.

Feel free to nominate eligible candidates not included on the above lists. ALL candidates meeting the requirements are eligible.

STEP TWO: NOMINATE

Only Canadian citizens may nominate. Once you have made up your mind whom or what you want to nominate, go to the official CSFFA site at:

< http://www.prixaurorawards.ca >,

and click on the 'Register/login/nominate/vote' line at the upper right to arrive at the 'CSFFA Membership login' page. To login you must become (or be) a member.

To register as a member, go to the bottom of the page and click 'Register.' Membership (which also entitles you to vote on the final nominees) costs \$10 for the calendar year. Follow the instructions re payment. A society membership account number will be sent to your email address. Once you have it, go back to

< http://www.prixaurorawards.ca >.

And login at the CSFFA Membership page. It will ask you for your email address and society number, then pass you on to the nomination forms. You can either fill them out online or download the forms and mail them in.

NOTE: You can nominate up to three candidates in each category.

CUFF VOTING NOW OPEN!

2013 Campaign Information:

Nominations are now open to find a CUFF delegate for 2013. We are looking for a fan

from Western Canada to come attend <u>Can-</u> <u>Con</u> in Ottawa this October as the CUFF delegate.

Traditionally, the location of <u>CanVention</u> alternates between Eastern and Western Canada. in 2013 CanVention will be held at Can-Con in October, 2013. The CUFF delegate will be chosen from nominees residing in the Western region of Canada, defined as Manitoba and parts West.

The delegate is welcome, even encouraged, to stay longer than just the convention and hang out with the local fans.

In order to be nominated for the CUFF this year an application must be submitted by **April 21, 2013 (midnight - EST)** to

The application must have a minimum of three supporters from the West and three people in the East. It should contain a letter describing who you are and why this would be beneficial for you and your community.

Voting will be open **May 1st** and close **June 10, 2013** (**Midnight EST**). This will allow the successful candidate enough time to work with Can-Con programming and to schedule their visit.

Canadian Unity Fan Fund provides for a Canadian science fiction and/or Fantasy enthusiast to attend CanVention on the opposite side of the country. CanVention is the annual convention of the

Canadian Science Fiction and Fantasy Association.

Any Canadian **fan** or **pro** may individually nominate a fan to be this year's CUFF delegate by sending an email outlining your reasons for believing that the fan would make a good delegate. to:

If you (the **nominator**) are not known to the current fund administrators Debra Yeung or Kent Pollard, you must indicate the name and contact info for a fan who is known to one of the administrators, so that they can confirm you are an active fan. The same process will hold true for voting.

Voting, when open will be permitted by anyone who has been active in Canadian fandom for two years prior to the Canvention, (so for this year, October of 2013) or anyone who has a membership to Can-Con 2013. Voters are required to make a donation to the fund of at least \$5.00

STATUS OF THE CANADIAN FANED AWARDS

The second annual Canadian Fanzine Fanac Awards were presented last October at VCON 37, the official venue for the CFF Awards.

The Awards were:

Best Fan Artist: Scott Patri

Best Fan Writer: Taral Wayne

Best Loc Hack: Michael John Bertrand

Best Fanzine: SWILL with Neil Jamieson-

Williams

and

Life-Time Achievement: Nils Helmer Frome

because he is the first known Canadian fanzine editor & publisher (back in 1937), whose SUPRAMUNDANE STORIES was also the first Canadian fanzine to gain a wide reputation among North American fen.

The master copy of the award figurine 'The Faned' has been sculpted by Monster Attack Team Canada member Lawrence Prime to a design by fellow MATC member Eric Chu. The 'Faned' stands seven inches tall.

I am still attempting to get the 'Faned' figurine replicated and sent off to the winners but have not yet succeeded in determining a method that will work or in finding anyone willing to do it. The search continues.

The first year's winners were declared by fiat.

Last year I consulted with active fanzine fans to determine peer opinion in an unofficial poll.

This year I hope to put into place a nomination and voting procedure modeled after the British NOVA Awards, or maybe after the American FAAn Awards. The former features a nominating process followed by a voting process, whereas the latter is more streamlined in that the process of nominating multiple choices with assigned numeric priorities results in a 'vote' according to points scored. I haven't made up my mind yet.... R. G. Cameron

Auroran Lights 7 is here, and the deadline for voting in the Auroras is past. We have indeed voted, did our Hugo duties as well, and now, I have this fanzine. Even though it's a list of nominees, a few comments are in order. Well, they should be, let's see if I can make them.

I sometimes see David Nickle at conventions, but sometimes I will see him at local events, too. David is a reporter for the Etobicoke Guardian, and covers city matters, mostly at City Hall downtown, but sometimes at the Etobicoke Civic Centre, the old Etobicoke City Hall, just up the street from us. Unfortunately, I rarely see David's articles, unless they are picked up by the Toronto Star...the Etobicoke Guardian ended its store sales and did away with paper boxes, and its distribution policy is houses only, and they will not distribute to apartment buildings.
